

PMI-Portland Mentoring Helps Shift Happen

Perceptions play a large part in our daily activities. Our perceptions of our colleagues, clients, tasks, and work performance can enhance or cloud our judgment. This impacts our decisions greatly. Confiding with a mentor can give a twist on perceptions, and help us make the right decision.

My favorite part of a business trip is the take off from Portland. I've usually spent a lot of time to get the house and pets in order before leaving, and wrapped up tasks with clients to give some breathing room. To soar above the landscape and experience the aerial view gives me a new perspective to everything. I think differently when out of my routine at the office. I see things in a new way and it seems easier.

Having a mentor gives that same change in perspective. Do you have you an experienced and trusted advisor? PMI-Portland is just completing our first pilot of a formal mentor program with stunning results.

"The Mentoring program helped me find someone who I could support their professional development and show them a little bit about my perspective. The experience has been and will continue to be rich for the both of us." - Matthew Horvat, Mentor

A small group was selected for the pilot - 6 pairs of people. The plan for the fall is to have at least 10 pairs, but with the interest 15-25 seems reasonable. Typically the mentor/protege team meets every other week for an hour or so. Kay Pexa, the director of the program has provided a structure (with the professional guidance of Jean Richardson) to help assist with facilitating the conversation. The relationships have proven useful by everyone involved. Allocating time has been a challenge - mentors are usually very busy people.

"I think once the hour is scheduled and the call or visit is accomplished, the outgoing smiles, laughs or lighter shoulders is doubly worth the sacrifice we made to make it happen." - Pam Banning, VP of Professional Development

Experience Required

We are all capable of performing more than the roles listed in the work history section of our resume. Some have developed their careers in project management over many years, while others are just starting to learn and/or apply their knowledge of PMI's project management practices. In either case, each of us has a formal employment history that provides a map of where we have been in our careers. Even more important than where we have been, is where we want to go next. As we look towards our future career goals, the two dreaded words that always appear are, "Experience Required." This in turn creates the

classic "catch 22" of how does one get experience in a new role if experience is required to start? The traditional approach is to highlight your transferable skills, wait for new opportunities to appear, and then lobby diligently in hopes of being considered on a trial basis.

Luckily, there is an easier way to ensure your career map leads you down the path that you choose: volunteering. By actively seeking out volunteer opportunities you can gain valuable experience, add to your resume, show your dedication to the profession, and prove to yourself and perspective employers that you have the skills needed to succeed.

Imagine if you were to hear from your surgeon before beginning a major operation that you were going to be their first attempt at performing that procedure. Would you be a little nervous? The surgeon could explain their education, their history of some similar procedures, and give you a reassuring thumbs-up and a smile. However, your confidence would be shaken due to their

lack of specific experience (assuming you hadn't already bolted out of the room). Just as we wouldn't easily accept this type of risk, many employers won't accept the risk of giving you a chance to try something new because of the investment of time and money involved – the risk of failure. This is especially true in this down economy when the applicant pool is often filled with others who have specific work history to offer. This is precisely why volunteering is so powerful. Volunteering provides opportunities for growth and experience.

The PMI Portland offers many volunteer opportunities and

welcomes new volunteer members each month. The chapter thrives because of its many talented and dedicated volunteer contributors. In trade, each volunteer is building his/her list of accomplishments, applying their skills to an

area of interest, and continually expanding their network of professional relationships. We now have a rotating list of staffing agencies eager to work with us and have learned which ones keep their commitments. He has manned the table at every dinner meeting where he actively engages with attendees and provides guidance to the collateral we provide and people who can offer help.

The Jobs email notification process is one of Jerry's core responsibilities where he works with recruiters to post job openings to those members signed up with this service. He has worked with the Operations team to develop an online Jobs listing that will be launched soon.

Jerry demonstrated initiative when he learned of the InnoTech Conference opportunity to co-market the event which offered discounts to members and a free booth for PMI Portland. He crafted a proposal which was approved by the board and recruited volunteers to man the booth. 
