Project Management Certifications - The PMI Portland Chapter offers several certification preparation courses each year. These courses are designed to target key concepts needed to focus on passing your exam.

- PMP/CAPM Prep Course usually offered twice a year
- PMI-ACP Prep Course usually offered once or twice a year
- Other Prep Course offered from time to time as appropriate

PMP (Project Management Professional) is the most industry-recognized credential for project managers. Globally recognized and demanded, the PMP® demonstrates that you have the experience, education and competency to lead and direct projects. This recognition is seen through increased marketability to employers and higher salary; according to the PMI Project Management Salary Survey-Seventh Edition, certification positively impacts project manager salaries.

CAPM (Certified Associate in Project Management) is a valuable entry-level certification for project practitioners. Designed for those with little or no project experience, the CAPM® demonstrates your understanding of the fundamental knowledge, terminology and processes of effective project management.

PMI-ACP (Agile Certified Practitioner) is PMI's newest certification and recognizes knowledge of agile principles, practices and tools and techniques across agile methodologies. If you already use agile practices or your organization is adopting agile methods, earning the PMI Agile Certified Practitioner (PMI-ACP)® certification will demonstrate your knowledge of and commitment to this rapidly growing approach to project management.

Career Development Opportunities - The Professional Development team offers numerous educational opportunities to build your knowledge and skill and to maintain your credential status through continuing Professional Development Units (PDUs).

- Workshops -in-depth knowledge areas, soft skills and project management trends and generally 8 to 16 PDUs
- Mentor program opportunity to mentor others and be mentored is offered twice a year both with PDU prospects
- Online courses varying in length and PDUs offered
